Sign up for the SHE Academy 2019 to be held at Lyon University in France.

The SHE Academy is a unique opportunity to critically discuss research methodologies, analytical perspectives and dilemmas from practice in an international learning environment, with input by leading scholars and experts from the field of school-based health promotion and education.

This is the seventh course organized by Schools for Health in Europe Network Foundation (SHE). This year in collaboration with University College South Denmark and Unires. The focus is: research methods in School Health Promotion.

The SHE Academy will be organized in a dynamic and flexible way, to meet the interests and needs of the participants with varied experience, needs and fields of interests.

The program will be structured around plenary lectures, dialogue and group sessions for all participants and a range of parallel workshops, for PhD students, researchers and practitioners respectively. PhD students will get the opportunity to present their research in smaller groups and get feedback on selected issues of their choice (e.g. methodology, data generation, data analysis, implications, recommendations). Other participants, researchers and practitioners, will also be able to present their research and/or practice case studies and get feedback.

#### By train:

Main international trainlines will take you to Lyon Part Dieu Station. From Lyon Part-Dieu you will take an intercity train (TER) to St Etienne Châteaucreux station. Intercity trains run every 30 minutes to an hour depending on the time of travel.
