The main aim of the SHE RG is to support the development of school health promotion and health education in the WHO European region by instigating, facilitating, coordinating, upscaling and initiating theoretical and empirical research.

The objectives are: (1) to facilitate and coordinate research development in the field of school health promotion and health education, contributing to conceptual development and research-based evidence for the development of the health-promoting school approach, and (2) to contribute to research capacity building and provide consultancy for the SHE members in collaboration with the SHE Secretariat.



#### What are the activities/ways of working of the SHE RG?

The SHE RG will support and encourage its members to:

- form joint working teams for research purposes (projects, funding applications, conducting research reviews, and events, etc.),
- participate in and establish a variety of activities, such as workshops in conferences, researcher (or student) exchange, joint PhD-supervision, sharing data, webinars and seminars, learning modules, finding keynotes or lecturers,

- participate in scientific meetings and other recognized distinguished positions representing the SHE approach,

- disseminate research findings through publications, conferences, and other scientific and public events.



#### External evaluation 2020

- A combination of data collection methods
- 16 operational objectives of which Coordinating the activities of the SHE Research Group is one activity (OO 3.4)
- The evaluation's methodology was determined and facilitated by the clear and explicit OOs and related targets and indicators described in the SGA 2020. In order to summarize the evaluation's findings and provide clarity, a set of codes has been applied:

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*** indicates 'completely fulfilled' (very close to 100 %)
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- \*\* indicates 'almost fulfilled' (10-15 % short)
- \* indicates 'partially fulfilled' (about 50 %)
- O indicates 'not fulfilled' (close to zero)
- !!! indicates 'over-performance' (110-115 % and above)



### External evaluation 2020 cont.

Operational objective 3.4: Coordinating the activities of the SHE Research Group.

- Deliverable: Report on SHE Research Group activities, including research groupmeeting and capacity workshop.
- Targets:
  - Number of participants at the SHE Research Group meeting + workshop (30 participants, output).
  - Participants who positively evaluated the SHE Research Group meeting + workshop (90%, process). \*\*\*
  - SHE Research Group members who actively uses the network as part of their daily work (80%, outcome). \*
  - Number of project proposals or joint articles resulting from collaboration among SHE Research Group members (two, outcome). \*\*\*!!!

To conclude, OO 3.4 has been completely fulfilled (\*\*\*).



- Describes the basic principles which concern the authorship in joint SHE RG publications.
- The aim of the guideline is to provide a short description for collaborative work and to ensure that each researcher is recognized in the scientific publication or conference presentation.

The SHE RG includes researchers from various disciplines. Practices in publishing process vary among disciplines, and especially in multi-disciplinary and international projects and publications, it is essential to be aware of the differences, and to discuss thoroughly about authorship issues before the writing process starts. The Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE) recommends that researchers discuss authorship when the research is being planned and that a written record is kept of the decisions. SHE is committed to a culture of ethical authorship.



- The group (involved with the manuscript) themselves plan and decide the responsibilities and discuss and confirm who will be doing what and by when. If the situation changes, everyone has to be informed about it. Agreement must be reached on how the contributions are to be acknowledged in the publication. When agreeing the authorship of an individual publication, it is important that everyone involved is aware of the decision made.
- The authorship agreement is recommended to be a written document. The group also discusses if the work carried out for the publication does not qualify the contributor for inclusion in the list of authors but can be included in the publication's acknowledgements.



- Publications have to comply with the general principles of authorship such as described in the "Recommendations for the Conduct, Reporting, Editing, and Publication of Scholarly Work in Medical Journals" of the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (<a href="http://www.icmje.org/recommendations/">http://www.icmje.org/recommendations/</a>)
- The document includes criteria for the authorship.



- If two or more RG members have authored the publication in collaboration, the SHE can be mentioned in the Acknowledgement section (in conference presentations also a logo of SHE can be used). This applies when a publication with a close link to the SHE is written. Please, inform the SHE Secretariat if you write a paper and acknowledge the SHE in it.
- If the group has got financial support from the SHE for publication, the following sentence has to be included: This work was supported by the Schools for Health in Europe Network Foundation and has received funding under an operating grant from the European Union's Health Programme (2014-2020)\*.
